

Greed behind climate inaction: Archbishop

THE Anglican Archbishop of Polynesia, The Most Rev'd Dr Winston Halapua says some G20 leaders refuse to admit the damaging effects of climate change on Pacific Island states.

"For some of us from the Pacific Island states, the truth is as plain as writing on the wall, our land and livelihood are drowning while others refuse to see."

The Archbishop was in Brisbane last week to represent the 85 million-strong global Anglican Communion as part of the Oceans of Justice campaign, a worldwide campaign led by the Anglican Alliance in partnership with ABM, calling on the G20 to discuss climate change.




The **Who is My Neighbour? Photographic Exhibition** is a moving and educating display of images brought to you by Anglican Board of Mission.



The last few decades have brought with them some major shifts in the way that mission is understood. Today, the distinction between 'home' and 'world' mission is blurred, and separating 'mission' from 'development' is no longer straightforward.
