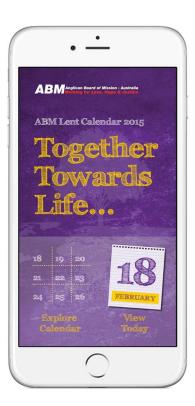

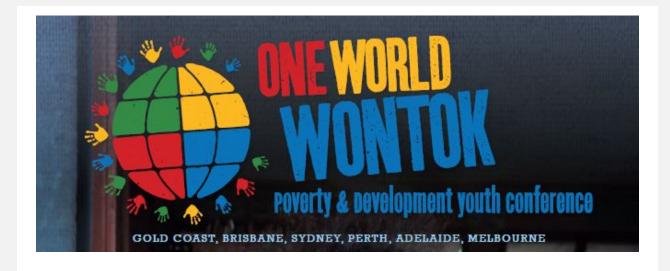

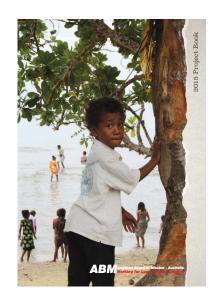

Last year St John's Anglican Cathedral in Brisbane were unable to hand out their traditional Easter eggs, as they couldn't find any that were affordable and #traffikfree.

When a chocolate is certified with **Fairtrade**, **Rainforest Alliance** or **UTZ Certification** steps have been taken to ensure the chocolate is **#traffikfree**. Farmers who take these steps are using labour practices where human trafficking is prevented. These farmers need the support of Australian supermarkets and consumers.

global development. It demands that educators and community leaders go the extra mile to ensure young people are aware of the broader structures and incentives affected by their international experiences..."

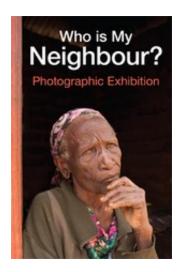

THE REAL EASTER EGG CAMPAIGN-AUSTRALIA

The Meaningful Chocolate Company Ltd has launched a pilot project called **The Real Easter Egg Campaign-Australia.** This pilot project involves churches and schools in Adelaide and Melbourne, with the hope of bringing the campaign to Australia. The Real Easter Egg Campaign started in the UK in 2010 and tells the story of Easter.

What is The Real Easter Egg Campaign – Australia?

The Real Easter Campaign aims to establish giving a Real Easter Egg as a tradition. More than 270 million chocolate Easter eggs are exchanged every year in Australia. The Real Easter Egg, which is coming to Australia in 2015, will be the only one which is made of **Fairtrade chocolate**, has an Easter story booklet in the box and makes a donation to the development charity Traidcraft Exchange.

How to get involved

This year is a pilot year and so orders can only be made by churches and schools for delivery to the cities of Adelaide and Melbourne. longer straightforward.

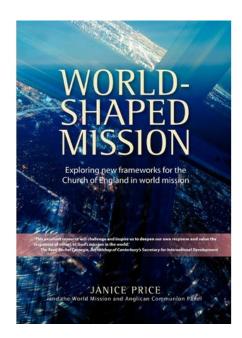
