2017 ABM Lenten Reflections

Each reflection in this series follows a similar format:

- The Gospel reading for each Sunday is listed, with links to the complete text of the reading for those using digital devices. You are encouraged to read through the passage several times before looking at the written reflection or the questions for group discussion.
- Brief comments reflect on some aspect of the text or comment on the passage in the context of the Holy Land today. These comments may serve as a stimulus to think more deeply about the Gospel reading.
- Questions for small group discussion are included at the end. These typically focus more on the Australian context as we seek to link the world of the text and the world behind the text with our own world. These questions may also serve as stimuli for individual meditation, including a personal spiritual journal.
