** ABM Prayer Theme: Episcopal Community Action for Renewal and Empowerment (E-CARE), the community development arm of the Episcopal Church in the Philippines, partners with ABM's Anglicans in Development unit and is helping to build self-reliant communities in the Philippines. Their Asset-Based Community Development program, otherwise referred to as ABCD, uses a development approach focusing on the identification and use of a community and its members' assets and skills as a means to improve their capacities and drive their own development as opposed to solely relying on external grants and assistance. Receivers to Givers is a program developed by E-CARE which allows communities to receive support and to engage in their own projects. In time, those communities are able to 'pay it forward' by going from being receivers to being givers and they then partner with new groups, helping them to achieve their goals. Give thanks for all that E-CARE achieves as they build strong communities.

Anglicare's adult literacy classes are vital for helping people make up for lost opportunities and to become contributing members of PNG society, either through further education or employment.

The seminary is the national ordination training college of the Anglican Church in Zambia, training students from all five Anglican dioceses in the country. Their training prepares them to minister in fast-growing urban and rural congregations of the Church. The college, which receives a small monthly grant from the National Church, does not charge tuition fees, in order to enable students from poor dioceses to attend. However, this operating grant is not enough to cover the seminary's expenses. St John's is dependent on donor aid for staff salary support, maintenance, its internet facility, and books for both the library and students' use after their training.

- * ABM Prayer for the Day: Give thanks for the Literacy, Language and Numeracy Project in Vanuatu. The project sees ABM working with the Anglican Church of Melanesia and volunteer teachers to provide valuable language, literacy and numeracy skills to people in Vanuatu, particularly in remote rural areas.

The land-locked Central African nation has one of the highest rates of child marriage in the world, with 6% of girls married by the time they have turned 15 and 31% by the age of 18. This is in spite of 21 being the legal age for marriage. Girls are 10 times more likely to marry before the age of 18 as boys. Child marriage usually means an end to a girl's education and her hopes for a better life. It can impact on her health, and many child brides experience

domestic violence. Child marriage is often a result of poverty, as it relieves parents of

daughters from the financial burden of feeding and educating them into young

- ** ABM Prayer for the Day: Give thanks for the Youth Engagement Project which has been set up in the Diocese of the Northern Territory to fund Church initiatives which engage young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. Community leaders expressed a desire to try to break some of the destructive cycles they were observing, by engaging their young people more in the church. Culturally relevant resources have been produced for these communities to use in their existing programs and church services with good results. Partner Profile

Episcopal Community Action for Renewal and Empowerment (ECARE)

In the early 2000s, the Episcopal Church in the Philippines (ECP) began exploring a new approach to doing development work which was then being talked about in community development circles. This method was known as the Asset-Based Community Development – or ABCD – approach which focused on the strengths, assets or resources of a particular community as the key ingredients to fashioning a positive vision for their future rather than on its needs, problems and weaknesses.

The leadership of ECP decided to forgo all grants from its 'Mother Church', the US-based Episcopal Church, from 2005. Despite initial misgivings from Church members, the move was a good one, and the ECP budget came in with a profit for the first time in two decades. This experience taught ECP that self-reliance is something achievable. Since then the Church has been encouraging poor communities in the Philippines to look at their assets and go from there. ABCD has helped communities go from strength to strength. The ECP's development program, the Episcopal Community Action for Renewal and Empowerment Foundation (E-CARE) was officially launched on Saturday 31 May 2014 at the St Michael and All Angels' Training Centre in Poblacion, Tadian, Mountain Province.

Receivers to Givers is a model as well as a program developed by E-CARE where the provision of livelihood assistance to partner-communities enables them to support not only their own projects but also the projects of other communities. It facilitates the development of communities from being receivers to eventually becoming givers. R2G operates to complement the ABCD approach as well as address its inadequacies in the Philippine context.



Praise God for the transformation that is occurring through E-CARE and its work.
