A part of St Andrew's Cathedral School in Sydney, Gawura is a unique, coeducational Kindergarten to Year 6 day school for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children who live at home with their families. Engagement of the Gawura families, parents and carers is critical to the success of the program. With up to 28 students, Gawura is a highly-acclaimed, highly-regarded 'lighthouse' model for Indigenous education, offering students a supportive, nurturing space where they feel secure and learn at their own skill level, participating in individual numeracy and literacy programs. They achieve academic milestones daily and grow in their abilities in academic subjects, sport and the arts.

Their training prepares them to minister in fast-growing urban and rural congregations of the Church. The college, which receives a small monthly grant from the National Church, does not charge tuition fees, in order to enable students from poor dioceses to attend. However, this operating grant is not enough to cover the seminary's expenses. May Christ's holy Name be glorified by the Church in Zambia.

Remember especially Kerina Evangelists' College at Tsendiap in Papua New Guinea, and St Peter's Bible School at Toungoo in Myanmar.

The program is aimed at equipping fathers, mothers and other carers with enhanced skills for raising healthy, happy children. In the process, it also helps participants to understand their own parenting style, and family relationships more broadly. Men have found the course particularly helpful and many have begun to see fatherhood as something much broader and richer than simply meting out punishments.

- ABM Prayer for the Day: Give thanks for the Disaster Risk Reduction and Climate Change project in the Solomon Islands. This year ABM will use funding to support the Anglican Church of Melanesia (ACOM) to work with selected communities which are highly vulnerable to the impacts of climate change and disasters, including local Anglican secondary school, Selwyn College. At Selwyn, ACOM will improve drainage around the school, which is located in a narrow low-lying strip between the sea and hillsides. Improved drainage will reduce the impact of flash flooding during heavy rains. In addition, ACOM will work with selected vulnerable coastal communities to demonstrate and train women in doing Backyard Gardening which increases crop yields and thus reduces vulnerability to climate change. To do this ACOM will be supported by technical expertise from local organisation, Kastom Gaden. The women will also receive training in nutrition. These 'lead gardeners' will then train others in their communities.

Give thanks for those Christian leaders who are part of the Northern Territory Discipleship Track, who are able to access much-needed training and support as they seek to witness to Christ in their communities.

Give thanks for the witness of the saints of the Order, martyred amidst the ethnic tensions in the Solomon Islands in 2003. Wrapped in white robes, they follow the Lamb wherever he goes.

With increased incomes from sustainable farming, farmers are more assured of meeting their basic needs, such as sending their children to school, paying health care costs, and providing themselves with reasonable shelter.

Thursday 22 August

- ** ABM Prayer for the Day: Give thanks for the Gender and Governance project which is helping to end the practice of child marriage in Zambia. The land-locked Central African nation has one of the highest rates of child marriage in the world, with 6% of girls married by the time they have turned 15 and 31% by the age of 18. This is in spite of 21 being the legal age for marriage. Girls are 10 times more likely to marry before the age of 18 as boys. Child marriage usually means an end to a girl's education and her hopes for a better life. It can impact on her health, and many child brides experience domestic violence. Child marriage is often a result of poverty, as it relieves parents of daughters from the financial burden of feeding and educating them into young adulthood.

Gawura

ABM is proud to support *Gawura*, the 'school within a school' that is an integral part of St Andrew's Cathedral School in Sydney. *Gawura* exists to give Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students the same opportunities as their non-Indigenous peers. As students 'graduate' from the *Gawura* primary program, they are offered scholarships at St Andrew's Cathedral School for their secondary education. In 2017, three *Gawura* students completed Year-12 at St Andrew's Cathedral School, taking their Higher School Certificates.

Founded in 2007, Gawura has achieved real success. Here are some outstanding examples:

Georgia and Rachel are Wailwan women from the Gomeroi Nation. They left St Andrew's Cathedral School in 2015, having been part of the original student cohort in 2007.

Rachel is currently studying a Bachelor of Law/Arts at the University of Sydney. She has worked as intern at Terri Janke, an Indigenous IP Law firm and will complete her degree at the end of the year. Rachel hopes to work in the Indigenous Community after her graduation.

Georgia has completed a Bachelor of Arts (Sociology) at the University of Sydney and this year began a PhD at ACU in Aboriginal Education and Positive Psychology. Georgia is the first Gawura student to commence a PhD.

Graduates like Georgia and Rachel give so much happiness and hope. Both make themselves available to help *Gawura*, they have visit our students to inspire them and help with career opportunities for high school students.

As does Kas, who is the first *Gawura* graduate to be accepted to study at the University of Oxford. Kas will begin her work there in September to study for a Master of Science degree in Clinical Embryology.

It's great to see how *Gawura* is setting up their students for success. These three exceptional, inspirational women are wonderful examples of how good a grounding *Gawura* can provide to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students.
