150th Anniversary of the Coming of the Light

The Holy Communion

Preface

This Order of Service has been put together by members of the Anglican Diocese of North Queensland. It is designed for general use in the Australian Church to celebrate the Coming of the Light.

There are five languages commonly used in the Torres Strait Islands:

- Meriam Mir (MM), the language of the Eastern Islands
- Kalaw Kawaw Ya (KKY), the language of the Western Islands
- Kalaw Lagaw Ya (KLY), related to KKY, used in the Central Islands
- Yumpla Tok (YU), a form of Melanesian pidgin
- English (EN)

Where part of the ritual is well known, then it has sometimes been replaced by one of the other languages. In that way all those worshipping can join with the people of the Torres Strait in their own languages. So, for example, "Hear the word of the Lord" is translated "Karngemin kuiykulmay ya" (which is from KKY). Native English speakers might find this a bit confronting – but in our world we all must speak many languages. However this Order of Service is designed so that there is only one liturgy, not one for each language – because we want all the people of our Church all over Australia to celebrate together! For that reason there is only one Confession and Absolution – because we are all guilty and all saved as one people of God.

However, so that everyone can understand, most of the liturgy is in English, and a pronunciation guide is provided for the languages. It is based on the Second Order of Holy Communion from *A Prayer Book for Australia*.

Hymns are not set – so each congregation can choose those most suitable. The Bible readings can be in any of the languages, and there are many good versions of the Bible available in English, though we tend to use the Good News Bible in the Torres Strait.

For the people of the Torres Strait Islands, the Coming of the Light is celebrated as a time of joy. Whilst the colonial period had its trials, we are so grateful that God was on both sides of the beach on 1st July 1871, both with the missionaries and those who received them. May our Lord bless all who use this liturgy, and may our worship glorify God and bring others to the light of his son Jesus.

GATHERING IN GOD'S NAME

Hymn

Blessed be God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Blessed be God's kingdom, now and for ever.

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life." John 8.12

[Let us pray.] Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Christ the Son of God, has been revealed as a light to the nations.

Silence may be kept.

Let us bring our darkness to his light, confessing our sins in penitence and faith.

Merciful God, our maker and our judge, we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, and in what we have failed to do: we have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves; we repent, and are sorry for all our sins. Father, forgive us. Strengthen us to love and obey you in newness of life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. The Absolution. Standing, the priest says

Almighty God, who has promised forgiveness to all who turn to him in faith: pardon you and set you free from all your sins, strengthen you in all goodness and keep you in eternal life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Lord, have mercy (Kyrie eleison) Lord, have mercy

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to God's people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

The Collect of the Day [Let us pray] Almighty God, you have given to the people of the Islands of the Torres Strait the glorious light of the Gospel of Christ: mercifully grant that we may always walk in the light of his love, and give us the strength and unifying power of your Holy Spirit to spread that light and enlarge your kingdom in the hearts of all people. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Karngemin kuiykulmay ya:(Car-ngem-in kue-kul-my yah) Eso Awgadhapa. (KKY) (Ess-oh Awe-god-harp-ar)

After supper he took the cup and gave you thanks. He shared the cup with them and said, 'This is my blood poured out so that sins may be forgiven. Do this in remembrance of me.'

[Let us proclaim the mystery of faith] Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

You have gathered us together to feed on Christ and to remember all he has done for us:

Fill us with your Spirit that we may follow Jesus in all we do and say, working for justice and bringing your peace to this world that you have made.
Accept our prayers through Jesus Christ our Lord.
Blessing and honour and glory and power are yours for ever and ever. Amen.

As our Saviour Christ has taught us, we are confident to pray, Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen.

THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD AND THE COMMUNION

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. We who are many are one body,

for we all share in the one bread.

Come let us take this holy sacrament of the body and blood of Christ in remembrance that he died for us, and feed on him in our hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

The body of Christ [the bread of heaven] keep you in eternal life. **Amen.** The blood of Christ [the cup of salvation] keep you in eternal life. **Amen.**
